Rhyme Time goes D.C. II, 4/22/10 puzzle

This week's puzzle was inspired by "Tricky Ricky Kane's" popular newspaper feature, "Wordy Gurdy," one of our own favorites and distributed by United Features Syndicate Inc. But we've put a new banking twist on Kane's concept. Each answer is a pair of words that rhyme, and both have the same number of syllables. They all have a connection to the Washington politics of money or banking today. The number in parentheses after the clue represents the number of syllables each word contains. Here's a sample:

The answer is "Seller Teller."**
