Ben Franklin and money just seem to go together. Many of the best-loved sayings about thrift, savings, and money come from this Founding Father, either directly or through his pen name, "Poor Richard," eponymous author of *Poor Richard's Almanac*. Nearly two dozen banks and savings institutions have "Franklin" somewhere in their names. And Franklin has long had an association with American currency. Indeed, as a printer, he devised an early form of anti-counterfeit currency for New Jersey, and wrote a paper called *A Modest Enquiry into the Nature and Necessity of a Paper Currency*. Fittingly, in April the government unveiled a new \$100 bill, continuing with Franklin's picture, and featuring new anti-counterfeit measures (see above).
