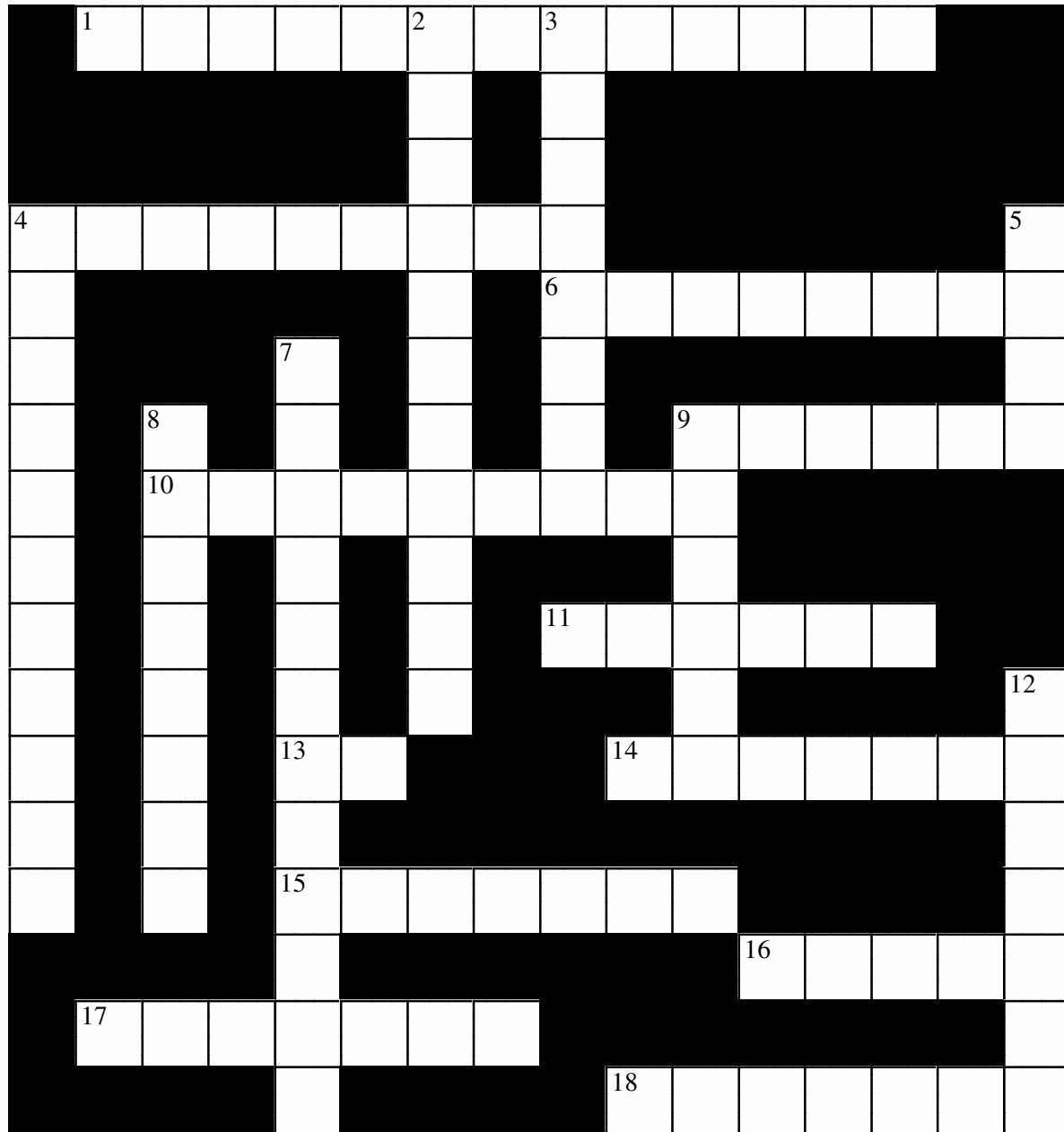


ABA BJ Puzzle of the Week: 10/8/10

ACROSS

1. Climbing guide company that assisted charity climb party to Kilimanjaro's summit.
4. Link Laurie Stewart had between climbing team's camps and home.
6. Native phrase, used by Tanzanian guides on Kilimanjaro advising climbers, which means "slow-slow."
9. Name of Tanzanian guide to the Mount Kilimanjaro party who has been climbing for more than 30 years.
10. Distinct feature of Kilimanjaro terrain that's pictured on series' main page, for fifth installment.
11. Name of the high camp, the last camp prior to the summit attempt.
13. A short description for a long, long climb.
14. Name of the fourth night's camp.
15. Other than some chirpy brown birds and unusual crows, the only wildlife the party saw while on Kilimanjaro. They were primitive.
16. Airline whose employee upgraded Laurie Stewart to first class after hearing that she was climbing for a cause.
17. Essential part of the climbers' support team.
18. Coffee-enhanced city that Laurie Stewart calls home.
