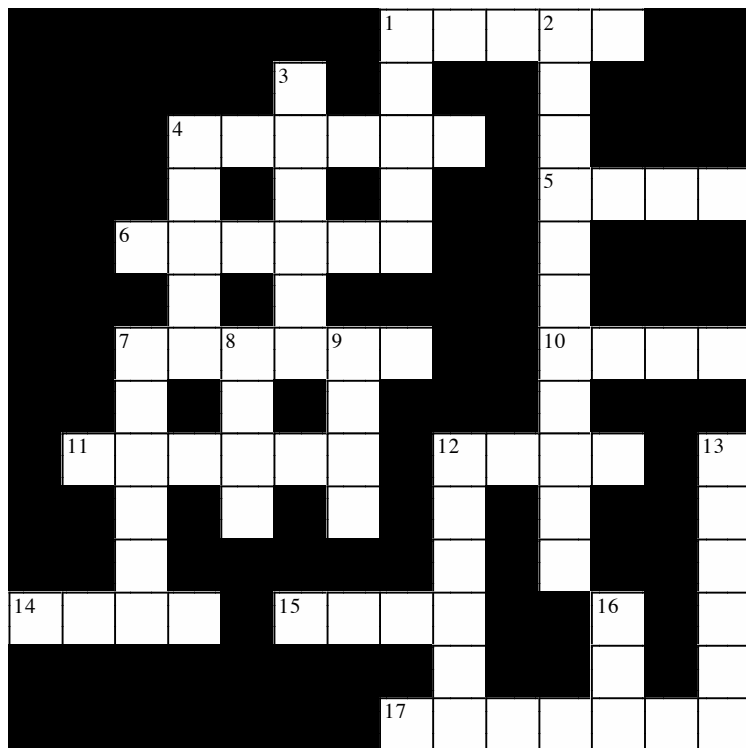


Foreign Exchange: *Come Fly With Me*
